The Digital Tattoo Project aims to encourage learners to think about their presence online, help navigate the issues involved in shaping their digital identity, and educate folks about their rights and responsibilities as digital citizens. To do this we use an interactive website, social media, workshops, and teaching resources. The Digital Tattoo Student Project Coordinator position works collaboratively with a team of staff, faculty, and students and will be responsible for website content development, workshops, marketing, and promotion for the Digital Tattoo Project, with two direct supervisors.

*Identify gaps and research current issues around digital identity and online reputation to ensure the Digital Tattoo website resources are up-to-date, inclusive, and serve diverse learner needs.

 - Educational tutorials, videos, blog posts, infographics, and other forms of multimedia.
 - Facilitating workshops for UBC and the broader community
 - "Train the trainer" style materials to support others interested in delivering instructional workshops and presentations on digital identity to a range of audiences.
- *Market and promote Digital Tattoo to UBC students, faculty, and staff, as well as the broader community using traditional communication and social media tools.
- *Apply best practices for the creation and sharing of open educational resources. Developing and maintaining inclusive and accessible resources.
- *Evaluate the effectiveness and use of the Digital Tattoo Project educational resources using tools such as web and social media analytics to ensure the high quality of resources.

- *Work independently as a leading member of the Digital Tattoo Committee which includes students, professional staff, and faculty members from multiple institutions.

Most duties are complex, requiring a high level of critical thinking, independent thought, and sound judgment. Students

are expected to identify issues around digital literacies (data ownership, online presence, etc.) and consider effective ways of educating others on these topics as well as keeping stakeholders updated.

Contribution to the University Community:

The work of the Digital Tattoo Project Coordinator plays a key role in fulfilling UBC Library's goal to support students in the development of digital literacies, in particular, those related to online practices, privacy, and identity by creating tools and resources on these topics. They also support providing a safe and crucial place for reflection on online engagement which will only continue to grow in significance given the effects of the pandemic.

Our workplace prioritizes student working experience, with an emphasis on the flexibility of work hours, support for workers' needs, and value placed on worker perspectives. We provide training and support to ensure an equitable and inclusive workplace, including conversations about positionality, diversity, and inclusion; workshops with campus partners to promote wellness; regular check-ins for student staff input; and ongoing support with navigating work-life balance.

Student Learning Components

Supervision & Training:

The position will begin September 1st, 2022, and runs until April 30th, 2023, at 10 hours per week. Training is a requirement of the position and will be scheduled for early September.

ORIENTATION

Provided by two direct (staff and faculty) supervisors: week of scheduled training including position explanation and expectations discussion, introduction to web programs (Teams, WordPress, etc), review of comprehensive online orientation materials, and introduction to Digital Tattoo Committee members.

Technical programming training is provided by two Centre for Teaching, Learning and Technology staff who also make up the Digital Tattoo Committee.

FEEDBACK & ONGOING TRAINING

Feedback opportunities will be provided through the following: weekly check-ins to discuss progress and answer questions in a work location

directly adjacent to supervisors, scheduled biweekly Digital Tattoo Committee meetings to discuss project directions, implementation strategies, and team goals, as well as ongoing feedback available inperson, online chat and email.

Extensive online documentation is available for ongoing support to students in all aspects of the position (see

http://wiki.ubc.ca/Documentation:Digital_Tattoo_Student_Orientation).

Technical training and ongoing professional development sessions are provided to supplement student knowledge including video and audio editing programs (Camtastia, H5P etc).

REFLECTION

Formal performance reviews and goal setting once per term with a strong self-reflection component to enhance job performance and develop skills related to long-term career goals and graduate competencies.

MENTORSHIP

Student will be mentored to develop project management skills and digital competencies through step-by-step project planning in staff meetings and training opportunities through the Centre for Teaching and Learning, UBC Studios education, and 1-1 staff training.

Mentorship in learning resource design and development, as well as in social media strategy, by experts in those fields.

NETWORKING

In creating content presentations, and blog posts, students will have the opportunity to interview and connect directly with experts and other student staff from across the UBC campus and the larger community. Through our working partnership with the University of Toronto iSchool, the project coordinator will work with students at the UofT Library on social media posts and other online projects in support of the Digital Tattoo website, connecting them with peers from another institution from different academic backgrounds.

LEARNING & PROFESSIONAL GROWTH

Through ongoing discussions, each student is encouraged to tie the work to their personal interests and bring creative passions around digital identity to their work goals for future growth.
