Summary of the role Education, training and experience	As an Art Cataloguer, you'll play a pivotal role in documenting and organizing our extensive art collection, contributing significantly to our vision of utilizing art as a catalyst for healing and community-building. Join us in this meaningful journey at the intersection of healthcare and art, where your passion for cataloguing will contribute to the wellbeing of individuals and communities.
	Reporting to the Art Collection Curator, you will collaborate with the Curator and other volunteers in examining, researching, documenting, and cataloguing works of art at St. Paul's Hospital. This includes entering information into a cataloguing software for PHC's art collection and archival records and updating as changes occur. Education in fine art, art history, museum studies, archiving, or similar discipline – sufficient to successfully perform essential functions of the role. Museum registration or related experience; condition reporting and art handling experience are preferred, but not required.
	Prior experience with works of art and collections organization is preferred.
	Knowledge of collection management databases is beneficial.
	Strong organizational skills and exceptional attention to detail are essential.
	Excellent communication skills, both oral and written.
	General office experience and strong research skills.
